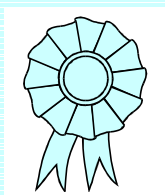

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round within course time will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog’s current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler’s discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog’s Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

SCHEDULE OF SUNDAY CLASSES. Dogs to be limited to 3 classes overall, including Team and YKC

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 2 (Starters)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.
Grade 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.
Championship Class	Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same Show
Any Size Jumping	Open to dogs not entered in any other Class at the Show

KENNEL CLUB Olympia Agility Stakes 2012, supported by GWF Joint Aid for Dogs



If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA LARGE DOG AGILITY STAKES

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final. Only one dog may qualify for the final (the first dog qualified at the semi-final). Once a dog has qualified for the final/semi-final,

further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not effect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham Championship Show at Stoneleigh.

The first eighteen dogs from each semi-final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

The 36 dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for the evening grand final at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1ft 5") at the withers.

This competition will be classified as combined Grade 6 & 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA MEDIUM DOG AGILITY STAKES

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 1 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not effect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi final. The first two previously unqualified placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi-finals which will be held at the City of Birmingham Championship Show at Stoneleigh.

The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 350mm (1ft 1¾ inches) and those measuring 430mm (1ft 5inches) or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA SMALL DOG AGILITY STAKES

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final. Only one dog may qualify for the final (highest placed dog at the semi-final). Once a dog has qualified for the final/semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition, although any placings in these further heats will not effect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi final. Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Small Dog Agility are those measuring 350mm (1ft 1¾ inches) or under at the withers

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will be invited to the semi-final at the City of Birmingham Championship Show at Stoneleigh.

The first ten will qualify for the final at Olympia.

This competition will be classified as Small Dog combined Grades 1 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

CRUFTS Singles Agility Competition 2012/2013



Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 6 & 7. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category (Small, Medium, Large) with 12 heats for each height, held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country.

Eligibility

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the final.

Qualifying

The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the Show does not award class places down to 10th.

The 16 large dogs, 10 medium dogs and 10 small dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the CRUFTS Singles Agility Finals at CRUFTS 2013.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have not qualified.

CRUFTS Team Agility Competition (Special) 2012/2013

These competitions will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7 with a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

There will be up to 8 separate heats for the large height category and up to 9 heats for small and medium category held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country.

Eligibility

This event is open to teams from Kennel Club registered clubs which, at the time of entry to the qualifying heat, have indicated in their Kennel Club registration details that they have an interest in agility. Each team entry will consist of 4 handlers with 4 dogs from the same height category, plus up to 2 reserves. Only dogs and handlers entered as reserves at the qualifying event will be permitted to compete for that team in the final should a change of dog be necessary. All team members must be members of the club at the time of qualifying for the CRUFTS Teams Final.

Clubs may only qualify 1 (one) team in each height category for the final at CRUFTS 2013.

Once a handler or dog has **run** for a Kennel Club Registered Club in a CRUFTS Team Agility qualifying event they cannot run for another Kennel Club Registered Club in a qualifying event at the same height category during the qualifying year. (Handlers or dogs entered as reserves may run or be entered for a different team, provided they did not run in the original team's heat)

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category.

As this is an agility competition the course must include 2 items of contact equipment. This is a team relay event and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the change over; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults.

Each elimination will incur a penalty of one hundred faults, any faults incurred prior to the elimination(s) and those after the elimination(s) will be counted to arrive at the final total faults for each dog. Multiple eliminations by the same dog will be marked as above. The total time of the team of four dogs must be recorded for marking purposes irrespective of the number of faults or eliminations that a team incur. If any of the team members fail to complete the course or any of the team dogs fouls the ring the whole team will be disqualified. Please note that some areas of marking for the Crufts Team event differ from standard marking due to the fact that it is a relay class with cumulative marking and time.

Qualifying

The winners of each heat will be invited to CRUFTS 2013 to compete in the Small, Medium or Large Finals. In the event that the winning team or club in a heat has already qualified for the final then the highest placed unqualified team in that heat will be invited to the final at CRUFTS.

YKC AGILITY DOG OF YEAR CRUFTS 2013

Open to YKC Members, handling any KC registered dog

There are 6 classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below:

Under 12 (handlers 6 years and up to but not including 12th birthday)

- Large dogs
- Medium dogs
- Small dogs

12 and over (handlers 12 years and up to but not including 18th birthday)

- Large dogs
- Medium dogs
- Small dogs

All ages are calculated at the first day of Crufts 2013 (March 7th 2013).

First and second place in each subdivision at each qualifying class will be invited to take part in the YKC Agility Dog of the Year Semi Final at Crufts provided that at least six dogs are entered into the division AND complete the course. If there are less than 6 dogs or entries were eliminated or did not attend only first place will qualify.



Skinner's Sevens Competition Rules 2012



An Agility competition for pairs of large dogs grades 3 –7 combined using a steeplechase style course. The class must be judged using current Kennel Club rules and a course laid with a baton change between handlers.

Class Title Skinner's Sevens Steeplechase Pairs Large Grades 3 –7 Combined Special

Class Style Spectator attractive steeplechase course with jumps and tunnels (no weaves) and MUST contain at least 1 Skinner's Spread (a rising spread set at maximum size). Course must contain maximum/minimum 17 obstacles and a hand to hand baton change behind the line. Mishandling the baton change 200 points penalty.

Entry Conditions 2 dogs and 2 handlers enter the competition and take part as a competitive partnership. No changes are possible once entry to each heat closes or to the pairs that qualify.

Qualifiers Each host venue provides 7 winning pairs to take to the final. 1st –7th places. Only the first 7 pairs qualify. No reserves are needed.

Notes

- 1) Handlers can qualify any number of dogs for the final who will run in draw order.
- 2) The partnership (2 dogs and 2 handlers) qualify so should one dog or handler of the pair be unable to take part in the final the pair cannot compete.
- 3) Only pairs that qualify at each heat will be invited to the final.

With over £1000 in competition prize money each heat will offer the chance to 7 winning pairs to be invited to the Autumn 2012 final.

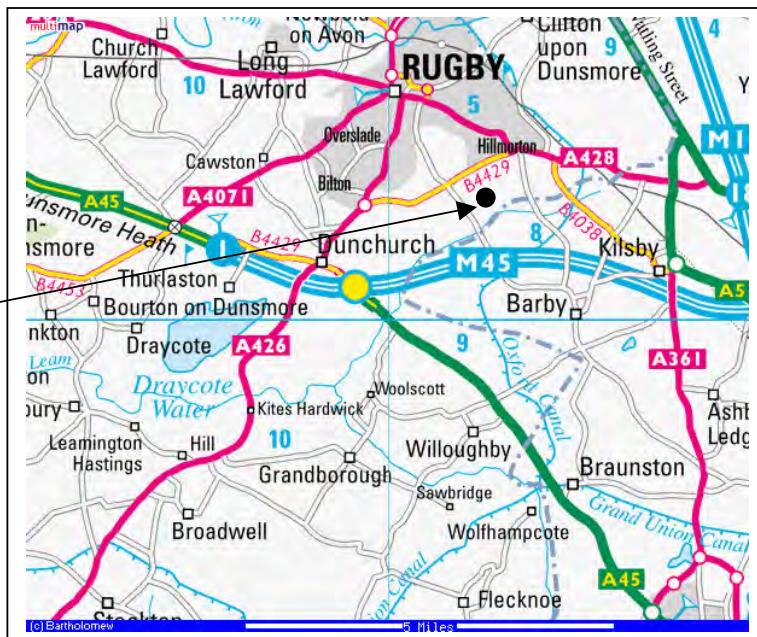
Regulations



1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees £2.80 per dog per class (RDTC helping members £1). Fee for Championship Classes £12.
3. Class 34 has prize money.
4. Internet entries will be accepted via www.iShowServices.com
5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Competition are not eligible for Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.
7. Not for Competition entries free and will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete or be brought to the Show or its environs.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show, which includes the car park, exercise area and camping area.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip or half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
13. Sponsors of the show are YKC, Joint Aid for Dogs, Skinners Pet Food and Bilton Veterinary Centre.
14. Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations apply – a copy of which is available on request.
15. The height of the jump obstacles will be 650mm (2'1.6") for Large dogs, 450mm (1'5.7") for Medium dogs and 350mm (1'1.75") for Small dogs. For Classes 23 and 54 height of jumps will be 350mm for large dogs and 250mm for medium and small dogs and there will be no weaves.
16. The height limit for dogs
 - a. Large Dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5 inches) at the withers
 - b. Medium Dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75inches) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5inches) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75inches) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
18. A dog shall be withdrawn and removed from the Show if it is:
 - a. a bitch which is in season
 - b. suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
 - c. interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - d. of such a temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e. likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 19th June 2012, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (29th June 2012). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances dictate, the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter the arrangements as necessary – such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a sae submitted within 1 month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
23. Should a judge deem a rerun is required, any result and /or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Free Passes – The Committee of an Agility Show and/or Flyball Competition shall provide all competitors with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued.
26. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
27. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club. In Championship classes competitors must run in exact running order specified in the Regulations. Dogs will be received, at the judge's discretion, until the management closes the class
28. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. Precincts of the show are the rings and a distance of 2 meters bordering the rings.
29. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
30. A Pay on the Day Class will be held if time permits.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. An owner (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the need of their dog is met, and should not knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the general committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
33. Ballot for Championship Class Running Orders
 - a. Agility Round and Jumping Round – A draw for the running order of the Agility and Jumping Rounds will be made prior to the Show. The relevant competitors will be notified before the day of the Show. The dogs must run in the order in which they are drawn.
 - b. Final Agility Round – Dogs to run in reverse order to their combined placings at the end of the first two rounds
 - c. A dog must have the same handler for each round of the Championship Agility Class
34. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
35. Dogs to be limited to **3 classes overall, including Team and YKC**. Dogs entered in too many classes will be removed from a class at RDTC discretion. Incorrect forms will be returned.
36. Should circumstances dictate, the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter the arrangements as necessary – such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
37. All dogs will be entered in the Show at their owners risk and whilst every care will be taken the Committee will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused, to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
38. The owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control ,i.e. held on a lead, whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches, except whilst competing or on the exercise area.
39. Championship competitors must indicate on the entry form if they wish their address to be withheld from publication.
40. If you wish your entry returned because camping is full this must be indicated on the entry form and a sae enclosed.
41. All lost property will be retained for two weeks after which it will be disposed of.
42. **There will be no changes of Grade on the day of the show unless evidence of prior notification is produced.**
